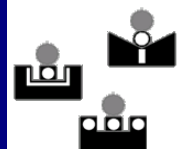

League Reports



Speed on Steel - Normally shoots the first Sunday of the month December thru March on the indoor range. Since the New Years Day holiday was the first

Sunday of the month, the league shot on Saturday the 7th this month.

We shoot at five targets on each of four stages (with some as close as 3 yards away) and each stage is shot four times, so the minimum round count is 80. For individuals new to steel shooting, this is a great way to learn how to shoot steel plates. For those who have shot steel before, it is a great way to hone those skills and to practice in a warm, dry, comfortable environment during the winter when the weather is too cold to shoot outdoors.

Sunday Steel — Conducted on the third Sunday of every month throughout the year, weather permitting. We shoot steel plates on stages of various designs and configurations (five strings of five shots each, only four fastest times count)

but we do not use the “standard” World Class steel stages. There are different stages each month. Shoots the third Sunday of the month. The January 15th match was cancelled.



Bullseye Youth League—We shoot on the 2nd , 3rd and 4th Sundays of the month at the indoor range. The league has seen an increase in junior

shooters. If you have a youngster that would like to get started in shooting Bullseye Pistol bring them on down.



OBRAMS— The 2012 OBRAMS league will start on April 21, 2012. We shoot action type stages using .22LR caliber pistols and carbines. The courses of fire are challenging and fun.

Bullseye League News— The Bullseye Pistol league is held on Monday nights at the indoor range. Relays are at 4:30, 6:00 and 7:30 PM. Cost is \$5 per relay for club members.

The Sectional Is Coming! —

The National Indoor Conventional Pistol Championship is conducted at local ranges throughout the country and the combined results determine the national rankings. The match is fired with a .22 caliber pistol at a range of 50 feet and the course of fire is 90 rounds. A Sectional will be conducted at the club on February 18th and 19th, 2012. The origin of Presidents' Day lies in the 1880s, when the birthday of George Washington—commander of the Continental Army during the American Revolution and the first president of the United States—was first celebrated as a federal holiday.

In 1968 Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Bill, which moved a number of federal holidays to Mondays. The change was designed to schedule certain holidays so that workers had a number of long weekends throughout the year, but it has been opposed by those who believe that those holidays should be celebrated on the dates they actually commemorate.

During debate on the bill, it was proposed that Washington's Birthday be renamed Presidents' Day to honor the birthdays of both Washington (February 22) and Abraham Lincoln (February 12); although Lincoln's birthday was celebrated in many states, it was never an official federal holiday. Following much discussion, Congress rejected the name change. After the bill went into effect in 1971, however, Presidents' Day became the commonly accepted name, due in part to retailers' use of that name to promote sales and the holiday's proximity to Lincoln's birthday.

Presidents' Day is usually marked by public ceremonies in Washington, D.C., and throughout the country.

TRAINING: In an effort to provide the best training possible for our YSB youth shooters, we are proud to tell you that Mr. Joe, myself, and my son Zak recently completed and passed an intensive *NRA RIFLE COACH* course held over 2 *very long* days up in the mountains of Hackettstown, N.J. FLAGS: The YSB is still collecting flags that are no longer fit for service. If you should have an American Flag that is worn, torn, or faded, please drop it in the box (folded if possible) at the indoor range. They are being collected for a proper retirement ceremony to be held next June.



Safe Table — The Indoor Range is only rated for pistol caliber ammo up to .45 caliber. Any ammo that is over .45 caliber or any center-fire rifle caliber will damage the backstop and could ricochet back towards the firing line harming the shooter or shooters on the range.

The use of shotshells, either in a shotgun, rifle or pistol is also not allowed. The pellets ricochet all over the range making them a hazard. Please do not use ammunition that is not approved. If you have ammunition that you are not sure of the velocity or whether it is allowed to be used on the indoor range, please contact one of the board members listed on page 2 for a determination.

Indoor range—ammunition NOT allowed -

- 5.7 x 28 in pistol or rifle
- No centerfire rifle ammo
- Pistol ammo with velocity over 1500 ft/sec
- .17 caliber in pistol or rifle
- Ammo with a steel or tungsten core
- Any shotshell ammo for any firearm

I feel that my 7 years as a member of the OBRPC, interacting with the Board, the league chairmen and the membership has provided me with the experience to act in the best interest of the OBRPC and the membership. Below are the topics which I feel are of the greatest interest to the membership of the OBRPC.

Financial Health of the OBRPC: We need to continue and expand the transparency of the OBRPC finances while maintaining the financial well being of the OBRPC. A club operating budget should be prepared each year.

Work Hours: I believe that the Board of the OBRPC needs to review the current "work hours" procedures. The new procedures would make sure that the tasks that we need to performed at the OBRPC are actually performed, but at the same time ample opportunities are given to the membership to obtain the necessary work hours needed during the year. A member's inability to obtain "work hours" should not be used as a operating revenue source for the OBRPC. Monies collected from "work hours" should only be used for facility improvement.

Smart Growth: In the last four years, the OBRPC has experienced a dramatic growth from the 300 members that the OBRPC had when I joined 7 years ago. I would review usage of all facilities to determine the optimum size of the Club's membership to maintain the "quality of an OBRPC membership. Bigger is not always better. Smart Growth is the way forward!

Indoor Range: We should be proactive in maintaining the OBRPC is indoor range, and thereby minimize the closure of the range during the year.

Permanent Outdoor Range: I would like organize a committee of members with the purpose of locating a suitable location for a permanent outdoor range.

Bring More Training to the OBRPC: I would like to organ-

ize a training committee at the OBRPC and bring Basic Firearms Training to its membership and their immediate family, at cost ,several times during the year. In addition, I would like to continue and expand the training at the OBRPC to include classes to increase performance at Bull's Eye, Steel, IDPA and USPSA matches.

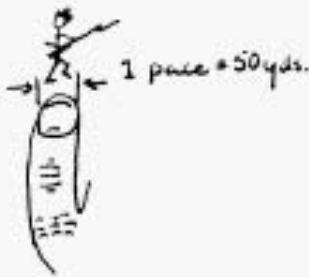
Here is an article sent in by club member Ron Saracino. It describes a way of estimating ranges that was used before laser rangefinders.

Range Estimation for Shooters is a tough job and the norm is that we could be in error by 10 to 30%. Civil War Sharpshooters used, "The rule of Thumb," it works like this. See Below;

This is the instrument of measure.

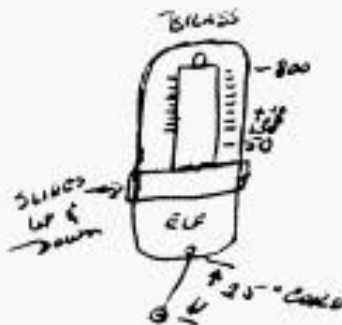


The Civil War Sharpshooters USED a SIX FOOT Reference on a device known as a "Range Stadium". Still available from Dixie Gun Works for around \$25. to \$35. (50 to 300 yards) very accurate.

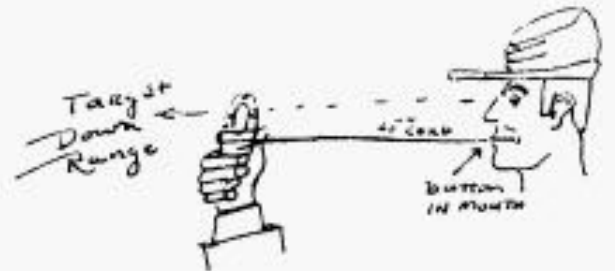


- 3 paces = 150 yards
- 4 paces = 200 yards
- 5 paces = 250 yards
- 6 Paces = 300 yards

Beyond 300 yards you need the "Range Stadium" device.

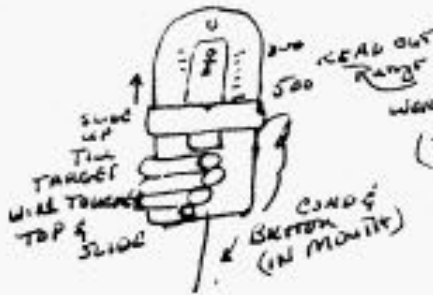


6 FT. I.D.M. at various Ranges.
