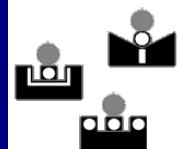

Outdoor Range — The combination for the entry gate will change on March 3rd, after the membership meeting. The new combination is printed on the back of your 2011 membership card.

Indoor Range — The Ladies' room is for Ladies only. NOT MEN! Please do not use the ladies room. Your cooperation will be much appreciated.

Use of the indoor range target frames — Only use ONE target on a target frame. The target is to be centered on the cardboard and hung at shoulder height.

Reminder — All members AND their guests are to sign the log book when they come to the indoor range. This is for their protection. The log provides a record that they were at the range, which is a legitimate stop in NJ when

transporting a firearm. The keycard swipe does not provide a legal record unless each member was to swipe. Guests would not be recorded at all.

Looking for a few good men and women — The club is looking to make basic pistol, rifle and safety courses available to members.

The Board is looking for a club member to run the courses. This person should be familiar with the basic gun handling and safety courses, and have experience in managing courses of instruction and instructors. The Safe Table

When using or storing a gun, always follow these NRA rules:



Know your target and what is beyond.

Be absolutely sure you have identified your target.

Know how to use the gun safely.

Before handling a gun, learn how it operates.

Be sure the gun is safe to operate.

Just like other tools, guns need regular maintenance to remain operable.

Use only the correct ammunition for your gun.

Only BBs, pellets, cartridges or shells designed for a particular gun can be fired safely in that gun.

Wear eye and ear protection as appropriate.

Guns are loud and the noise can cause hearing damage. They can also emit debris and hot gas that could cause eye injury. For these reasons, shooting glasses and hearing protectors should be worn by shooters and spectators.

Never use alcohol or over-the-counter, prescription or other drugs before or while shooting.

Alcohol, as well as any other substance likely to impair normal mental or physical bodily functions, must not be used before or while handling or shooting guns.

Store guns so they are not accessible to unauthorized persons.

Dozens of gun storage devices, as well as locking devices that attach directly to the gun, are available.

Be aware that certain types of guns and many shooting activities require additional safety precautions.

Getting Started Competing in Practical Shooting

The members of Old Bridge Rifle and Pistol are fortunate in that we have many opportunities to compete in practical shooting competitions; OBCATS, OBRAMS, OBDogs, PPC and Pro-Am Knock Down Steel. All have their roots in Practical Shooting and all will challenge you in different ways.

We're thrilled that you are interested enough in practical shooting to explore how best to get started. You are about to take the first step on an exciting journey to a new world of safe, fair, family fun with some of the greatest people you will ever know. You will discover that there are many advantages to competing in Practical Shooting, if for no other reason than the camaraderie that exists among like-minded enthusiasts!

Practical Shooting IS competition. Competition necessarily requires that there be more than one person taking part, so

the first step is to locate someone near you with whom to compete. Fortunately, Old Bridge Rifle and Pistol Club has many venues for Practical Shooting competition. Check the Club Calendar, then contact the Match Director to get the specific information that you need to have before your first match. Most of what you need to know is covered below. Here are a few pointers to make that first match a pleasant experience for all concerned.

For your first Match Experience:

Do take and wear eye and ear protection. It is our rule, it is a Club Rule and it just plain makes sense.

Don't assume you know more than you do. Use your first few matches to concentrate on watching, listening, and learning.

Don't assume that you will be allowed to shoot at your first match. Most Practical or Action type shooting events require that new competitors complete a "safety check" before shooting an actual match. At Old Bridge, our Match Directors will accommodate you on the day of the match, however you should let him know you are coming and also you need to show up early. Match Day is a busy day.

Firearms & Holsters

It may be that the firearm you already own will be just what you need to get started in practical shooting, but you may learn of other competitive opportunities that will give you that excuse you've been looking for to buy a new toy! As an example USPSA has six competitive divisions, delineated by equipment rules. IDPA, Steel and PPC all have a similar number. The good thing is that most times your current equipment will fit at least one division. So unless you are blessed with more money than you need, we recommend that you don't rush out and spend until you've had the opportunity to learn enough about the sport to make an informed decision.

Holsters must retain the firearm during any required movement, must cover the trigger of a holstered gun, must point to the ground when the firearm is holstered, and must be carried at belt level. Shoulder holsters, Cross Draw holsters, fanny packs, et al, are not permissible at our events. Some divisions have additional holster restrictions. For USPSA and IDPA you can check the rules online, but the best place to learn is to come out to a match.

Other Equipment that you will need

Other necessary equipment includes spare magazines or speed loaders and belt mounted carriers. In most cases at least one magazine will be included with the firearm when you bought it, but having at least five magazines is desirable to be sure to get you through the various stages in a match. Magazines should be available from the gun manufacturer or from a variety of after market sources. We recommend three to four belt mounted magazine/speed loader carriers, depending on the divisions in which you choose to compete.

Ammunition

Most Competitors reload their own ammunition, although some use factory loads. Reloading is common for reasons of both economy and performance. The desirability of reloading depends on the divisions in which you choose to compete and the caliber you select. The division choice frequently influences the caliber choice. The issues involved in caliber choice include magazine capacity, recoil, and the division rules.

Expectations

It is important to have realistic expectations as you approach competitive shooting. Many people, but most especially those without a lot of shooting experience, make unreasonable assumptions about this game.

Practical shooting is an exciting, fun, safe sport. Like any sport, though, it takes time and effort to become proficient. Like any sport there will be times when your progress is rapid and it's easy to remain focused on your goal. At other times it will seem that you're not getting anywhere and it will be easy to become discouraged. Consistent practice will take you where you want to go.
